“Spirit Power Tools”

Memory Verse: “...in Christ we who are many form one body....”
Romans 12:5

Lesson Overview: This is a two-part lesson to be covered over a two-week period. In this lesson, children will learn about developing the gifts that God works through his people for the common good of all people (1 Corinthians 12:7). In the second part of this lesson, they will learn about the different jobs God has created for his body. They will briefly learn what each gift is about, and how to use the gift as God desires to work it through them. Spirit filled children are more than willing to put the gifts into action--they just need someone to show them the way. This lesson concentrates on teaching children what these Spirit power tools are, and how to “plug them in”.

The Gifts: (Part I)

- (1) Message of Wisdom
- (2) Message of knowledge
- (3) Faith
- (4) Healing
- (5) Miracles
- (6) Prophecy
- (7) Tongues
- (8) Interpretation of tongues

Commissions: (Part II)

- (a) First of all apostles
[overseers of many churches]
- (b) Second prophets,
- (c) Third teachers,
- (d) Then workers of miracles,
- (e) Those having gifts of healing,
- (f) Those able to help others
- (g) Those with gifts of managing or directing [being placed in charge of something],
- (h) Those speaking in different kinds of tongues.

Requirements for the lesson:

- 1) Holy Spirit Baptism handout (Part I and II)
- 2) (Part I)
 - a) Wrapping paper
 - b) Scotch tape
 - c) Scissors
 - d) A stuffed animal (small)
 - e) A box (big enough for the animal)
 - f) A card and a pen
- 3) (Part II)
 - a) Assorted power tools and hand tools
 - b) A board
 - c) A regular screwdriver
 - d) An electric screwdriver

Object Lessons and Lead-in to the Lesson:

(PART I) “**The Assembly Line demonstration!**” Use some volunteers to demonstrate unity. The church needs every part—every person—in order to do God’s good work. No one can do it all, and God never intended for it to be that way.

If possible, you might even make two teams and see which works together best. Create a package wrapping assembly line. Make a big deal out of it. It’s the Acme Package Wrapping Company! You may want to make a big company sign, and signs taped on the front of a table where each worker is to stand behind.

Each member of the team has just one part of the wrapping process. As they will see, it takes the whole team (all the parts making one body) to complete the job. Break the team up this way:

- Worker #1: Has the gift, who passes it to the Box Person, Worker #2
- Worker #2: Boxes the gift, then passes it to a Tape Person, Worker #3
- Worker #3: Tapes the box shut, then passes it to the Paper Person, Worker #4
- Worker #4: Has the paper and a pencil. #4 measures it, marks it for cutting, and passes it to Worker #5, the Scissors person.
- Worker #5: Cuts the paper and hands the box and the paper to another Tape Person, Worker #6.
- Worker #6: Tapes the paper onto the box, and hands it to the Card Person, Worker #7.
- Worker #7: Has a pen and a card. Makes out the card and worker #6 helps #7 attach it.

Mission Complete!

Next, try it again, but this time remove Worker #6. Don’t let anyone fill this worker’s place—not even the other workers. Have them begin the process. When they reach a point where they have gone as far as they can, but cannot complete the process, then point this out. Explain that the group could not do a good job with the second present because everyone required to do the work was not present.

Emphasize that it is the same way with God’s work. If part of God’s family (the church) is missing or does not to their part, then the work we do for God is not very good. That is why it is important for all of us to do our part in our church—even God’s special little ones. They are important!

“**Weak Link!**” Take a piece of rope and cut it all but a thin strand or two. Take a hold of the rope at either end of the rope where it is not frayed. Explain to the children how you can pull as hard as you want in this area because it is strong. Then take both ends of the rope and pull it apart. Explain how the church is weak in the same way when someone does not do his or her part. (You can also use two pieces of chain with a paper link attaching each of them.)

(PART II) “**The Power Tool/Power Spirit Demonstration!**” Take along some power tools--the noisier the better. If possible, you might even find someone with a gas-powered chain saw. **Whatever power tools you choose to bring, make sure you can operate them safely in your classroom environment, and that all children are significantly away** (preferably sitting in chairs & no closer than 8 to 10 feet) **during the demonstrations.** Don't forget the girls (I.E.: mixer, blender, etc.) You will also need to take some hand tools; such as, a hand saw, a hammer, and a screwdriver. You might remark about the difference between “girl” power tools and “boy” power tools--just for the sake of fun competition (Girl tools being more dainty or sophisticated than with the boy's). Then, stress that God's Spirit power tools (the gifts of the Spirit) are like the power tools you brought to class. You might demonstrate how difficult and hard it is to screw or nail into a board by hand. You can have a child in the class give it a try. Next, demonstrate that with power tools, (such as an electric screwdriver) it's a snap. You can emphasize these points:

1. God's power tools (His Spirit power) get the job done much easier and quicker than our hand tools (our own strength).
2. God's power tools can do things our hand tools can't.
3. We *can't* do anything with God's power tools until they are plugged into a power source (the Holy Spirit). Just like other electric power tools, they will not run until they are plugged in. Demonstrate this as you talk about the point.
4. God can't use His power tools unless we pull the trigger (you got to be willing to act, or use them). They're not automatic. Just like the power tool you plugged into the wall socket, it has power in it, but you have to pull the trigger. Demonstrate.
5. You have to pray. God rewards those who seek Him. Elisha asked Elijah for a double-portion of the Lord's anointing that He had placed on Him. Explain that they have to pray for God to bless them with more anointing. You can demonstrate this by bringing out bigger and bigger power tools.

The Lesson: (Part I)

DO THE OBJECT LESSON: **“*The Assembly Line demonstration!*”**

1. God’s House

QUESTION: What is the biggest thing that you have ever seen? (Not like on TV, but you were actually there.)

QUESTION: How big do you think God is?

Our God is a very big God! He is so big, that we say he is bigger than the whole universe. We can say He’s bigger, because the Bible tells us that He is everywhere in it—and heaven too! Think about that. Have you ever traveled on a very long trip—possibly to another state? Do you remember how far it was? The very tip of God’s little toe is bigger than that.

Still, God says He needs us! He wants us to take care of His business on earth until He sends Jesus back to bring everyone who truly loves Him to heaven.

QUESTION: We often talk about “God’s House.” What exactly is God’s house?
(The church.) *Some children may say, “We are.” They are technically correct, and you may tell them so; however, simply say that we are talking about another house today—one of which “we” are all part.*

QUESTION: Why does God use us to take care of His house? (Let the children respond)

There are a lot of reasons why God would even bother with us. Let’s take a look at them and see if we are right.

a. He loves us

Yes! He wants us to be a part of what He is doing. He has a lot of different jobs for us to do. When your mom and dad want to show that they love you, they will often let you help them with a job they are doing. They teach you all that they know, and how to do some jobs by yourself. That’s why you feel like part of your family.

b. It Draws Us Closer To Him

It brings us closer to God and to others in our church. He wants us to be able to love others just like He loves us. When we do different jobs in our church, then we are helping each other out. The Bible says that we show we love Him when we love others—especially people who really need us.

c. It Makes Us An Equal Part

God says that we are family—right along with Jesus. God considers us all to be His son's and daughters. That means that we actually get to do things like Jesus did on this earth. We can pray for others, and we can help and teach them. We can lead people and show them the right way to go. Do you realize that God's word says that *you* are a leader? Some people may lead more people than others, but everyone in some way is a leader. Even your parents are the leaders over your family.

You could be a leader at school. When other kids want you to do something that you know is wrong, and you say, "No! That's wrong and I'm not going to do it", then you just became a great leader!

d. To Make Us A Strong Church

Do you remember what happened while we wrapped presents? Everything went well as long as everyone was doing their part. As soon as someone stopped, the whole thing fell apart. Have you ever heard the saying, "Something is only as strong as its weakest link"? This is so true.

DO THE OBJECT LESSON:

"Weak Link!"

2. Lots Of Jobs

God is so good to us that He even gave us instructions on just what we are to do in His wonderful church. *Have one of the children read 1 Corinthians 12:28.*

"And in the church God has appointed first of all apostles; second prophets, third teachers, also those having gifts of healing, then those able to help others, those with gifts of administration, and those speaking in different kinds of tongues."

Some of these may seem like strange jobs to you, and some of them you may not even know what some of them are. If you're going to do them, then you need to know what they are.

a. Apostles

Apostles are overseers of people. Sometimes we call them shepherds. When we use this word today, we are usually talking about someone who watches over several churches. They help guide the church along and lead them in doing what is right. Shepherds are like apostles, because they watch over several people.

QUESTION: We just read from the Book of 1 Corinthians. Do you know what apostle wrote this book to the Corinthian church? (Paul)

Read 1 Corinthians 1:1.

b. Prophets

Prophets proclaim the God's thoughts to His people, and also to countries and their leaders. They tell the truth about God's plan for the world and mankind. Many prophets wrote down prophecies in the Bible. Many of them told about Jesus coming to save the earth long before his birth. Many things the prophets wrote still have not happened yet, and some are happening in our lifetime, like Israel becoming a nation again.

c. Teachers

How would anyone know the truth about God's Word if it were not for teachers. Teachers train you up, and teach you how to live a good life for God.

QUESTION: Have you ever taught someone how to do something?

If you do this a lot, then God may have made you to be a teacher. A teacher doesn't just have to teach like this is a classroom. A teacher can also be a person that shows others how to do things, like sew, paint, build, fix, and others things. God's teachers lead you to Jesus, help you get saved, filled with the Spirit, be baptized, and to do the things of God.

d. Workers of Miracles

God even needs people to work miracles through.

QUESTION: What do you think a miracle is? (Something that comes by God's power, and not something that any man can do without God's help.)

God's miracles get others out of impossible situations, or does things that are impossible for men to do. He still does these things today—if people will still believe. When people are dead—really, really dead—God will use people to bring them back to life. When Daniel was put down in the lion's den, God worked a miracle. He kept him from being eaten by the lions, and delivered him out of the pit unharmed. That was an impossible situation!

QUESTION: Have any of you seen a miracle or maybe you got a miracle? (*This could be something the teacher could also share with the class, or invite someone in who has received a miracle.*)

e. Healing

God will use people to heal others who are sick or dying, and also heal deaf or blind people. Doctors today can heal many things, but there are some things that only God can heal. When a person gets what we call an incurable disease (one doctors can't heal), then they will die—doctors or no doctors. All the money in the world will not help such a person, but God can heal them in an instant. Would you like God to use you to heal someone? He will.

f. Helping

Being able to help others doesn't sound like such an important job for God, but it is. In fact, God's word says that people who are willing to do this kind of work will inherit great riches in His kingdom. Children can do all of these jobs, but they can especially do this one. Imagine what the church would look like in a few weeks if someone didn't clean it!

QUESTION: What are some ways that children can be a big help in the church? What would you like to do to help in the church?

Elderly people love it when young people help them. It is a way that young people can make the elderly feel wanted—like they're a part in God's family.

g. Administration

An administrator is someone who takes care of God's business in the church. There would be no leader in the church if it didn't have a pastor. There would be no children's activities if someone didn't point it in the right direction. Others in the church tell others how and when to spend the money that comes into the church.

h. Tongues

One strange job that God has given some in the church is the ability to speak in other tongues. We will go over this one later and explain it better. God allows us to speak in other tongues in a powerful way. Did you know that speaking in tongues is like a heavenly coded message. The devil can't understand what you are saying, but God understands loud and clear.

3. Discussion Time

It is important that you know that God wants to use you in many of these ways. You may be children, but the great thing is that God can work His power through you no matter what size you are. He can use you to raise the dead, heal the sick, help with certain jobs, lead and teach other children, and even work a miracle. Can you do something nice for someone today? OK, then God can use you. In fact, God has probably used all of you in this class in some way.

QUESTION: How do you think He has used our class?

Maybe you are thinking that you don't do anything right. If so, then you are in luck! God wants to use us even in our weak areas. He can make them strong areas. Remember that God wants to work *through* you, and not just *work* you. He has the power and He does the work.

4. Prayer:

God is ready and waiting to use you in so many ways. He wants to do it now, and not when you become an adult. God does this by preparing you to do His good work. If you have Jesus in your heart, then you are ready for service! God wants to fill you with His Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the part of God that delivers the great power of God to do all the things we have talked about. Imagine giving others words from God, or putting your hands on someone, and they are healed. Wouldn't that be great!

Allow everyone to close their eyes. Pay hands on and pray for any children that are willing to receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 12:12-26 says that YOU are part of the body of Christ [the Church] and these gifts and jobs are your "tools" for helping you do your part. YOU ARE IMPORTANT AND YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

The Lesson: (Part II)

DO THE OBJECT LESSON: **“The Power Tool/Power Spirit Demonstration!”**

1. God Expects Good Work

God is a master builder. Master carpenters always use the very best tools. Did you ever see a certain house being built? One day it was not there, and then it seems like the next day it was! That’s because the builder had power tools that helped him get the job done. God had Noah build the huge ark with just hand tools, and it took Noah 100-years!

QUESTION: How long do you think that you could stick with building a huge ship by hand, by yourself?

But that’s not all. Master builders make sure things are perfect! God gave Noah exact measurements for the ark—to a hair’s width! He expected nothing less than a perfect job. God himself built the whole universe perfectly, and He expects the same thing from His workers.

2. God’s Tools For Us

God doesn’t excuse sloppy work. If it’s sloppy, then He calls it sloppy. In fact, God says this about sloppy, lazy workers: If a man will not work, neither shall he eat (2 Thessalonians 3:10). But God is so good to those who love *and* serve Him. God gave us great, strong “Spirit” power tools to help us do His good work. He never wants us to do it alone.

a. The Tools!

QUESTION: Who in our class today knows that they are really filled or powered-up with God’s Holy Spirit?

QUESTION: How did it happen and what was it like?
(Teacher, feel free to talk about your experience)

READ: 1 Corinthians 12:8-11

These may sound like funny tools to you, but they are very powerful for helping everyone who believes, and is filled with the Holy Spirit.

(1) Message of Wisdom

God gives some people in the church the message of wisdom for a very important reason. It’s more than just being smart. Sometimes God will give a person a message about their future—even someone else’s.

QUESTION: What is “the future?”

(2) Message of Knowledge

God uses these messages to help guide us and stay on the right path. He may give you a message to give to someone else. He could say, "I want you to build an ark." He could say, "I want you to be a policeman, a fireman, a nurse, or a pastor. He can tell people many things, but just remember that God has a purpose for everyone, and He gives messages of wisdom to help guide others and us.

God also gives some messages of knowledge.

QUESTION: What do you think this might be?

God gives us messages that--after you get them--you just *know* something. It might not be something in words, but just something you suddenly know--and you *know* deep inside that it came from God. Maybe it's something about somebody else. Maybe a person is very troubled, and without them telling you anything, you just know what it is. Sometimes God gives others knowledge about a certain sin in someone's life.

QUESTION: Why do you think God would ever tell you something like a sin someone does? (*So you can pray for them, and maybe even help them stop doing it*).

(3) Faith

Another gift is faith, and the Bible says that faith is a gift that you can really get your hands on!

QUESTION: We talk about faith a lot at church. What is it?

Basically, **faith is knowing that God will do what He says He will do**. The Bible says that faith is something that you can touch or sense (know) that it is there.

QUESTION: How many of you can say that you believe Jesus has saved you from your sins—and you REALLY know it? (Let the children give a show of hands)

You couldn't put your hand in the air unless you got faith from God to believe and know it. What if you suddenly knew that when you went and laid your hand on someone that they would be totally and perfectly healed? That would be faith at work! Now, that's not thinking that if you do it someone **could** be healed, but that you knew it most definitely **would** happen.

In the Bible, Peter was in a boat during a storm, and Jesus walked out on the water to meet them.

QUESTION: What did Jesus' disciple Peter do? (*Got out of the boat, and walked out to meet Jesus—he walked on the water*)

QUESTION: What did Peter have to get in order to be able to do that? (*Faith, of course*)

QUESTION: But something happened: something went wrong. What happened? (*Peter began to doubt, sank, and Jesus had to save him*)

QUESTION: Have you walked on water lately? Do you think you would get faith to do it if you saw Jesus doing it? (*Probably so*)

The important thing to remember is that God will give you faith when you *ask* for it, and as you *need* it. Then, don't ever doubt!

(4) Healing

God will use people to heal others who are sick or dying, and also to heal deaf, blind, or crippled people.

QUESTION: Have you ever been healed by God's power, or seen someone else healed by His power?

There are some things that only God can heal. Sometimes God will heal right away, at other times over a period of time, and sometimes not at all. God heals people because He loves you and the person you pray for too. But the most important reason is because of His own purpose—not ours. Perhaps God has more work for a person to do, but they are dying. Do you think He will heal that person? There are lots of reasons why God heals people. Maybe someone who does not have Jesus in their heart would get saved if they saw God heal him or another.

(5) Miracles

God even works miracles through Christians. Last week we talked about God using people in His church to do miracles.

QUESTION: What is a miracle? (Something that comes by God's power, and not something that any man can do without God's help.)

God's miracles get others out of impossible situations, or do things that are impossible for men to do. He still does these things today—if His people will believe. God uses miracles to do the impossible. He does them to help others believe, give His people more faith, and to help us get His work done when it is impossible for us to do it alone. Say you were on your way to pray for a very sick person and your car ran out of gas? It is absolutely possible for God to put gas in the tank, even though there is none around. That's a miracle!

(6) Prophecy

The Old Testament of the Bible talks about lots of prophets.

QUESTION: What do you think a prophet does?

A prophet is a worker for God who announces God's Truth to others. When people do not do what He had men put in His Bible, then He uses a prophet to tell them that they are doing wrong. He will tell them what will happen if they are sorry for their sins and start doing right, and He tells them what He will do if they don't get it right. All God wants His people to do is do what is right. We all know that God rewards us for doing good. That's what He always wants us to do, but sometimes we get off track.

God warns us, and if we *don't* fix it, he cannot help us. Then the old Devil is able to get at us and mess up our life until we tell God we are sorry. When someone tells us a prophesy, then we *know* what's up. Either do right, or pay the price!

(7) Tongues

There's still more tools! This one's a lot of fun, and God likes giving it out! It's called tongues. It's the first tool that people got to see the disciples use! When God sent down His Holy Spirit, He used tongues to prove it. The disciples suddenly began to speak other languages, and all the people were amazed! Maybe you have heard someone in church speak something you didn't understand. If you have been baptized with God's Holy Spirit, then you probably already have spoken in a different "prayer" language.

Tongues is God's Holy code. You may not even know what you're praying, but God does. It's a "perfect prayer". Did you know that the Devil can't understand a word you pray in tongues? It's true, and it drives him crazy because he doesn't know what to go mess up. It's Holy coded prayer to God!

(8) Interpretation of Tongues

There is just one time when everyone knows what you said in tongues. It's called interpretation of tongues. Sometimes God *does* want to show somebody what this coded prayer means. We call this an interpretation. Did you ever see somebody talking in a foreign language on television, and someone else was repeating what that person said in English? That's an interpretation. God will give a person the meaning of what someone else says in tongues. You may have seen this during a church service.

b. Very Powerful Tools

These are all very powerful tools. God uses them through His people to show His power and might.

3. Why Did God Give These Gifts

God still wants to do far more than that through you. God could do all of these things without using us at all. He could do it with lightening bolt flashes and roaring thunder. God loves us so much that He wants to work through us.

a. The Gifts Are For Who

QUESTION: So why did God give us these gifts of power? *(They are for the good of all—helping others)*

QUESTION: Do you think they are just for Christians? *(God only lets Christians use them, but these gifts can be used to help anyone)*

Also:

- Bringing all people closer to God
- Leading those not saved to Jesus

b. Can I Pick My Own Gifts

QUESTION: Remember this? God's Word says that He is a picky builder. Do you get to pick the gifts you want? *(Not Really)*

God does want you to pray for them. You can ask Him, but it's up to Him. He does the gift-giving.

Read: 1 Corinthians 12:11, and discuss what it says. *(God gives you the gifts that He wants you to have.)*

3. Get a Witness!

Maybe some of the children have the Holy Spirit move in their lives, or have been used at some point where God did work a miracle. Perhaps some of them will share. If your class is not to this level yet, then you may want to bring someone in to testify to a miracle or gift that God has worked through them in a mighty way.

You may want to list the gifts on a board. Then ask the children to discuss the gifts they would like to see God work through them.

a. One body; Many Parts

Sometimes God wants to work more than one of these gifts through us. Remember that we are all one body, but we are many different parts. God will take a tool he has put in us, and use it with some tools that He placed into others—all at the same time.

b. Getting Down To Business

You may already be filled with God's Holy Spirit, but you want to see God use these gifts through you. This may be all new to you. You just got to remember that God will neither force His Holy Spirit nor His gifts upon you. And even if you have some of the gifts, you have to be the one to make them happen. God will do the rest.

QUESTION: So what do you have to do to get God's Holy Spirit Power Tools working in your life? (*Pray, believe, receive*)

1. You must have Jesus in your heart
2. Be Spirit baptized (Baptized with God's Holy Spirit)
3. Believe that God will put these gifts into your life
4. Pray for God's Spirit and His gifts be put into your lives
5. Just receive what He gives us for tools.

QUESTION: Will God use children for such an important task? (*YES*)

4. Prayer Time

*Without anyone closing their eyes, ask the children who would like to be Spirit-filled (baptized in the Spirit) or receive the gifts talked about this morning. **Eyes should not be closed, because at this point children should be making a stand for God.** Pray for each by the laying on of hands—one at a time. Allow those children you know that are active in the gifts to pray with you. This could be a good time to bring in a youth that can also testify. Afterward, give each child receiving the Spirit or gifts a handout: **“Gifts through God's Holy Spirit”**.*

Be sure to explain to each child's parents—the one's who received the Holy Spirit today—exactly what took place in their lives. Ask them to go over the handout with them at home.

Gifts through God's Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is our friend, companion, and teacher who gives us power to do things for God.

This is a list of God's powers (called gifts) that God works through us by his Holy Spirit. He can choose to do any one of these through us at any time, but we must let Him. God won't force us--EVER. We must want to participate. We may find that God will use us to do one, or even some of these gifts more than others. REMEMBER: The Holy Spirit is "HE," NOT AN "IT." He is a part of God.

Message of Wisdom - This is understanding all things through God's smartness, not ours. This is what we understand as God lets us understand it. Sometimes God will give a person a message about their future—even someone else's.

Message of knowledge - All facts given by God. He gives it to us by experiences and when we study the Bible. (What we know that God has given us) God will also tell us (or even warn us) about a person.

This is the difference between wisdom and knowledge: We can know that Jesus is our Savior (knowledge), but we understand that He is our Lord (wisdom) because we know Him.

Faith - Believing in God, knowing He will never lie to us or turn away from us. Faith is knowing that God is real, even though we can't see him. And, believing that God will do things through us in His important work.

Healing - Healing can be physically (in our bodies), mentally (in our minds), or spiritually (worshiping things other than God; greed, pride, hatred, jealousy, selfishness, and any other bad things). Through healing, God replaces these things with love, peace, joy, kindness, patience, goodness, self control, and faithfulness.

Miracles - This is when God does something that our minds tell us can't happen. An example is when God used Moses to part the Red Sea.

Prophecy – This is a message from God--through a prophet--to his people. It is a warning to turn from bad, sinful ways, back to God's Way.

Tongues - A special prayer language given by God. With a prayer language, we pray a perfect prayer, especially when we don't know what to pray! It's a Holy code between us and God, because Satan doesn't understand it.

Interpretation of tongues - When God gives someone the meaning to another person's tongues message. (Like a prophesy two-part prophesy)

Gifts - 1 Corinthians 12:28 - God has appointed first of all apostles [overseers of many churches], second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, those having gifts of healing, those able to help others, those with gifts of managing or directing [being placed in charge of something], and those speaking in different kinds of tongues.

Why did God give us these gifts? 1 Corinthians 12:7 says they are for helping others, Christians, and also those who are not.

1 Corinthians 12:11 says that God gives us the gifts that He wants us to have.

1 Corinthians 12:12-26 says that WE are *all* part of the body of Christ [the Church] and these gifts are our "tools" for helping everyone do their part. **YOU ARE IMPORTANT AND YOU DO MAKE A DIFFERENCE!**

Pray for the gifts God wants you to have and get to know the Holy Spirit. Getting to know God is exciting! **GOD BLESS YOU!**

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
